Design a times tables game – it may involve cards, a board, actions. Write instructions and be ready to share and explain it to the class!	Create a fact file about 2D shapes. Describe their properties and describe the angles that can be found within each shape. Find at least 8 shapes. Remember to draw them accurately using a ruler.
